Grand Knight Report (Jon Stafford)

Worthy Brothers,

Last night we held both an Exemplification and a business meeting. We welcomed Zane Rigler into our Council, and we are happy to have him! The business meeting was short as we are at the end of the year and there is not much left to do, which is nice because we've been really busy. I will highlight below what was discussed:

For the Grand Knight Report, I mainly thanked everyone for all their support with the events we helped make successful over the last month and a half. We served over 350 pancake breakfasts during the Santa Social, we covered three days of bell ringing with the Salvation Army, we're supporting the Joseph House in handing out toys to needy families later this month. We had a wonderful Christmas party as well as Memorial Mass reception. It has been truly a blessing to see us come together and support all these things and I can't thank everyone enough.

Coming up we are going to do our first Bull Roast planning meeting next Thursday 12/14 at Hoppers (located down next to the college) at 7pm. This is a joint project with the HSA so there will also likely be some HSA folks there to offer their insight as well. My wife, Cathy, is the head of the committee on the HSA side. The way I envision it is that the Knights will focus on the gaming side like we normally do, help with set up/clean up, some kitchen help, and see what we can do to find donations for food/drink similar to what we did for the Crab Feast. The HSA will worry about decorations, musical entertainment, selling the tickets, etc. I'm hoping that the partnership between our two groups will work well.

I read an email from our Seminarian, Harrison, he will be serving at the Christmas Eve Mass at St. Francis, if you see him introduce yourself. He also may attend our business meeting in January which would be cool. He also mentioned in his message to me that he has had some unexpected financial expenses at the seminary and was wondering if we'd be able to provide any additional financial support for him. We talked about it last night and voted to send him an additional \$250.

As a 3rd degree we are sponsoring 2 wreaths and our 4th degree is also sponsoring 2 wreaths.

If anyone can make it, this Saturday December 9th is the second Saturday and the Rosary will be said after the 5:30pm Mass.
