

Reports and/or Comments Grand Knight Report (Jon Stafford)

(As sent out in recent email from Jon)

Worthy Brothers,

We had our July business meeting last Thursday July 18th. There were 17 people present which is a pretty good turnout for the summer months although no one joined via Zoom. During my Grand Knight report I thanked those who were able to cook the BBQ meal for the Bible School Families on July 12th, I'm told that everything went well and it was a good event. I also spent a few minutes discussing other projects and initiatives I've been contacted about the Knights assisting with but have not given any commitment to yet. I want to make sure before I say we can help with events that we have people that are going to be willing to support them. I think of late I've commited us to things without really checking and then it's been a real challenge to get anyone to help out with the event. I'm going to list the events I mentioned in the meeting, for anyone who was not in attendance please take a look at these events and let me know if they are something you would be interested in helping out with.

9/29/24 (Sunday) We've been asked to have a table at the church Ministries weekend. What this means is we'd need to have two guys available to answer questions about the Knights and what we do after the 7:30, before and after the 10:30, and before the 12pm Mass. This is a great recruitment opportunity for us and enough of us attend these Masses that I don't anticipate there being an issue participating in this event. Also, if we are able to set up outside we can put out our new Corn Hole Boards as a way of drawing attention.

10/15/24 (Tuesday) The Pregnancy Center in Salisbury is holding a Golf Tournament at the Hyatt in Cambridge. They wanted us to be aware if we wanted to have guys play or possibly volunteer the day of the event. I don't have much more information on this, I just advised the person who asked that I'd pass along the info. Apparently the Pregnancy Center needs a bigger space due to growth so they are trying to raise money for it.

11/15/24 (Friday) The Athletic Boosters of St. Francis DeSales School are holding a Golf Tournament at Nutters. They are going to need day of event assistance, as it draws closer I should get more information. Also, they would welcome anyone who wants to play and I'm sure they will want us to sponsor a hole. As the event gets closer I can provide more details. Originally they asked if we would provide the meal for after the event but I told them I did not think that would be something we'd be able to do as they wanted BBQ style food (Pit Beef, Pulled Pork, etc.) for 120 people.

We are going to have all of our normal Fall events to plan for such as Tootsie Rolls, Soccer Shoot Out, Good Beer Festival, and of course our Crab Feast at the end of August so we will be quite busy.

Our next meeting for planning the Crab Feast (August 24th 1pm to 5pm) is going to be at Specific Gravity on July 30th at 6:30pm. If you are able to attend that would be great. We will likely schedule one more planning meeting after that just prior to the event.

Next business meeting is on 8/1 at 7:30pm in the church basement. Officer Installation is on 8/15 at 7pm and is a coat and tie affair for those being installed, spouses are encouraged to attend this event and there will be light refreshments following the ceremony. It will be Howard's first time presiding so lets all give him as much support as we can!

Howard was at the State meeting as District Warden. He attended the State meeting for incoming GK/DD/DW and brought back 250 Sweepstake tickets that we need to sell. These are different than in years past in that they can be mailed. The suggested donation is \$5 per ticket with the drawing being held at the Columbus Day Ball in October. There is a 1st, 2nd, and 3rd prize although I do not remember the dollar increments. Pleae contact Howard if you are interested in helping with this fundraiser. For every \$5 ticket that we sell, our council gets \$2 back. I believe Howard was looking for someone to chair this project so again, please reach out to him if you can help.

Barney brought us up to date on Family of the Month. It has been well received, the winners for the month of June were so happy with the honor that they posted it across their social media pages. The family for July was recognized at the 10:30 Mass this past Sunday. Barney said we will likely be recognizing a Hispanic famly during the 12pm Mass for the August winner.

This past Saturday July 20th our Council hosted the Ocean City council in a Corn Hole Tournament. I am happy to report that the trophy is staying in Salisbury for another year! A huge thanks to Ed, Stewart, Jim, and Dave for preparing an outstanding meal of crab cakes and fried chicken! Everyone was raving about how good that meal was.

We will be carrying that Fried Chicken recipe over to the Crab Feast next month so lets hope it is as well received. Dave Whipple will be posting pictures from the corn hole event in the next edition of the Franciscan. It was a great event with a great turn out, we're already looking forward to next year!
