

Grand Knight Report (Jon Stafford)

(As sent out in recent email from Jon)

6/15: Wiffle Ball Tournament at Cross Pointe Church on Nanticoke Road in Memory of Jason Rebok from 8:30 til 12:30. For those who don't know/remember, Jason was a Knight in our Council who died suddenly last year of a heart attack at the age of 43. He was somewhat new to the Knights but was very active and set to be the next Chancellor until his untimely death. His son attends St. Francis and is in the same class as my son and one of Joe Dernowski's daughters. If anyone would like to attend this event or is interested in forming a team to participate let me know. I've asked Jenn (Jason's widow) if there is anything the Knights can do in support of this but have not heard back.

6/20; Social Night held on church grounds likely in front of the Carriage House. We will set up the cornhole boards to practice for our Grudge Match with Ocean City of 7/20. We will also talk about plans for the upcoming Crab Feast on August 24th. Please feel free to bring your own drinks/snacks to this gathering. I'd like to meet at 6pm so we can get as much time as we want throwing cornhole and socializing together.

7/12: We have been asked to grill hamburgers/hotdogs for the Vacation Bible School program.
